

STATEWIDE AAG STATISTICAL INFORMATION AND DEMOGRAPHICS

Based on union requests for AAG demographics (which we asked for in order to analyze possible pay and other disparities based on protected identities), as well as general AGO statewide statistics, we have compiled the following information on WFSE-represented AAGs (**October 31, 2019 snapshot**). Note: this data has information for 580 total WFSE-represented AAGs provided by the AGO. No AAGs are excluded from the data, but the below information may not reflect different categories than AGO offices use in practice. For example, all Spokane and Tacoma AAGs are included in this data, but were listed by the AGO with division tags that are not specific to the Spokane and Tacoma offices (e.g. Multidivisional Legal Services Division, instead of Spokane Division).
